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LINC, Inc.'s Boarding School Plans Pass Rezoning Test and Advance to Pre-Construction Phase

With unanimous Wilmington City Council approval for rezoning of Wilmington fire station 3 at 3933 Princess Place Drive, LINC will finalize architectural plans and begin soliciting construction bids for the Hisan J. Polk Transformation Academy.

[Wilmington, North Carolina, April 29 2024] - The dream of a culturally- and academically-specific boarding school for young Black men in New Hanover County has moved past a rezoning hurdle with the Wilmington City Council's unanimous approval of updating zoning for the decommissioned Wilmington fire station 3 at 3933 Princess Place Drive. The property, newly zoned O&I (office and institutional), was previously zoned R-10 medium density single dwelling.

Frankie Roberts, LINC, Inc. Executive Director, is enthusiastic about the next phase of the boarding school project, which is finalizing architectural designs and soliciting bids for a general contractor. The school, which will be named the Hisan J. Polk Transformation Academy, anticipates the first cohort of twelve students to be admitted in late 2025.

"The academy will provide Black youth who have dropped out of traditional school with an alternative path to a high school diploma and a certificate in a trade that promises a solid, rewarding career path," says Roberts. "These will be young men who have attained at minimum a 7th grade reading level, and who will benefit from a focused curriculum that capitalizes upon their accomplishments rather than on their failure in public school."
