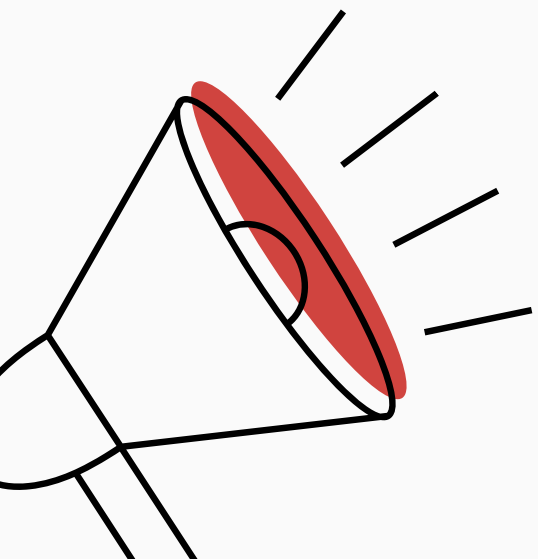

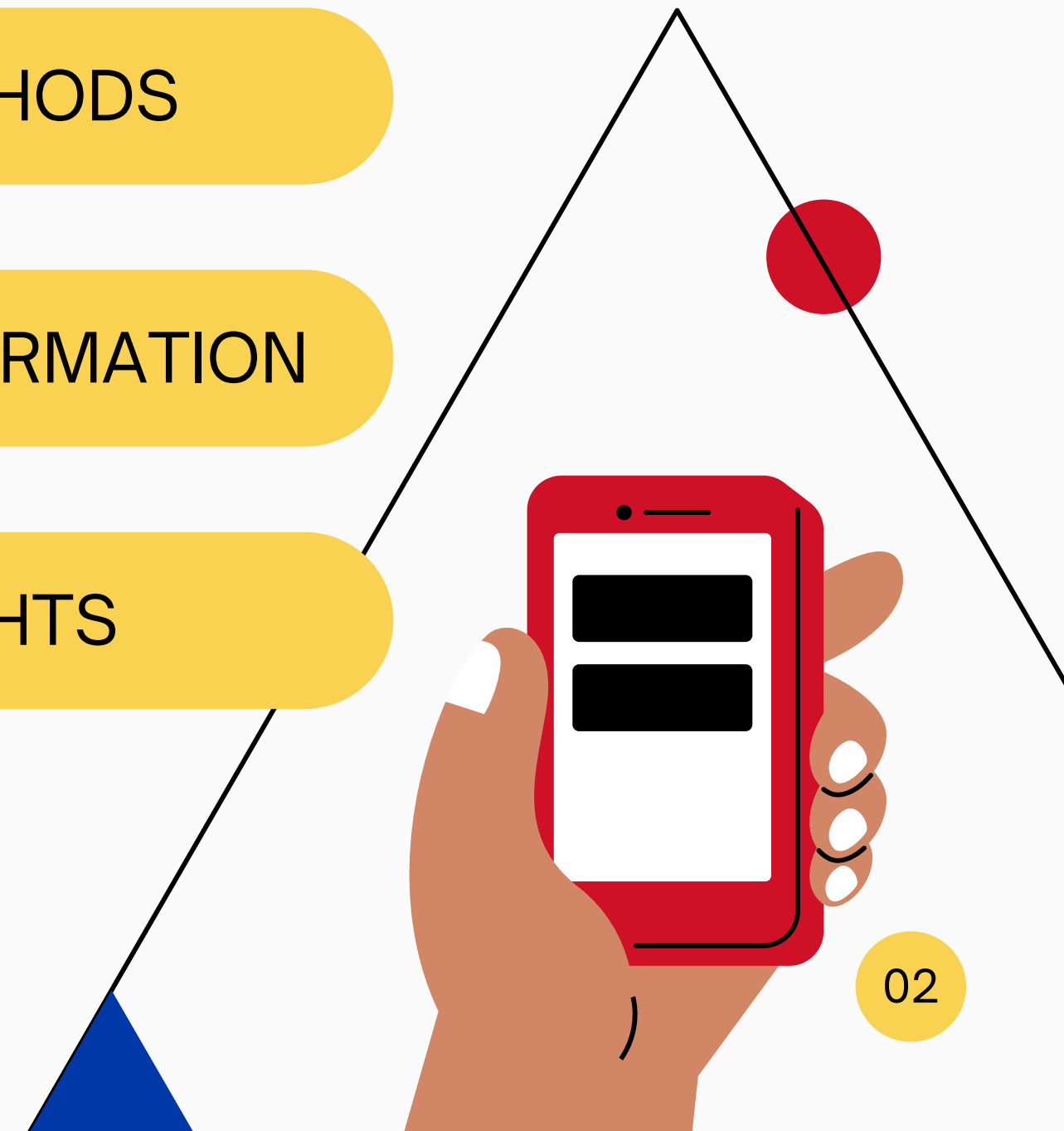

INTRODUCTION

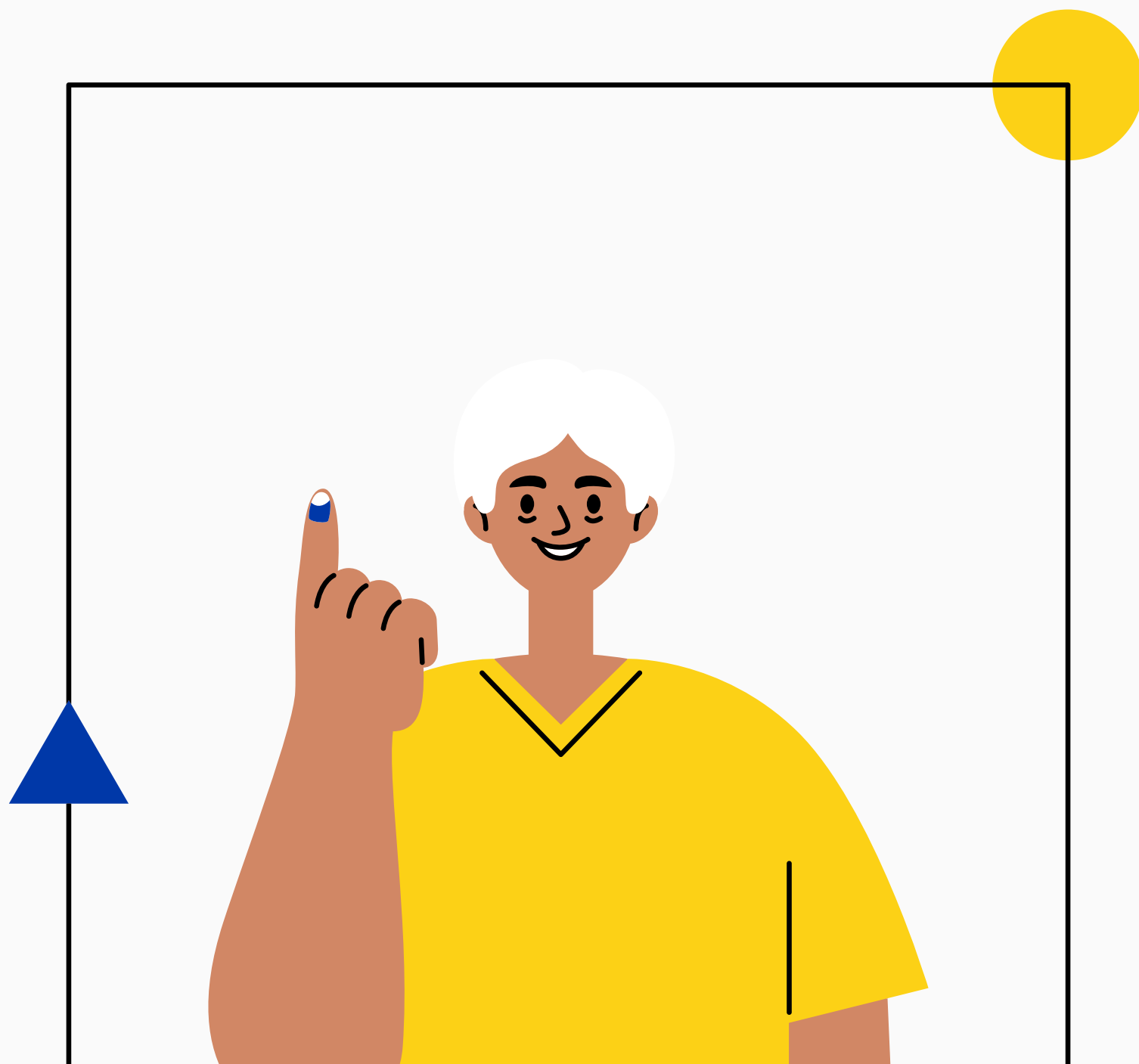
Welcome to the 2024 Election Voting Tips presentation.

We want to help you make informed decisions and have a smooth voting experience.

We are not asking that you endorse one candidate over another, we simply want to ensure you are making informed decisions.



VOTING ELIGIBILITY



In order to vote, you must be a registered voter in your state and be at least 18 years old by election day.

Make sure to check your voter registration status before heading to the polls. You can check your registration status [HERE](#)

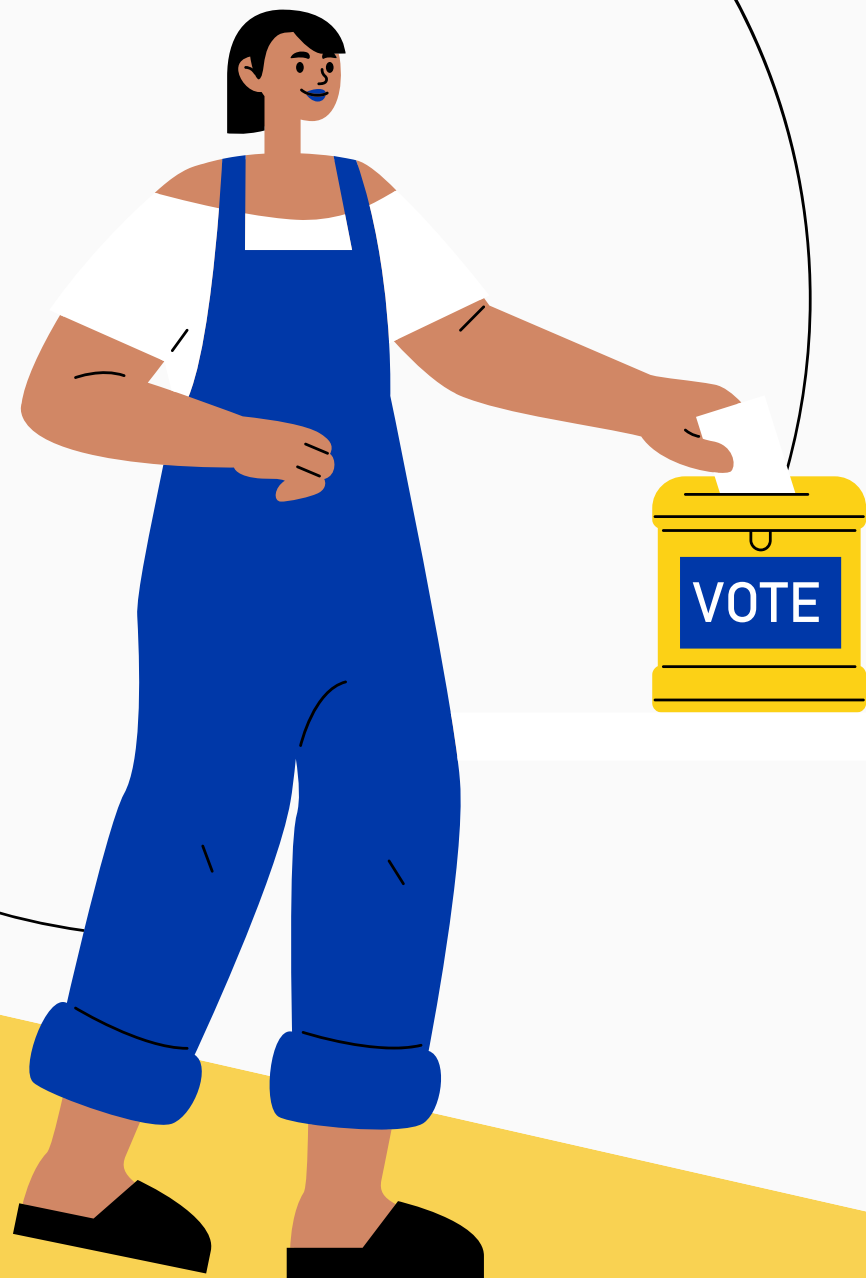
You must be a U.S. Citizen

Not be serving a felony sentence, including any period of probation, post-release supervision, or parole

VOTING METHODS

You have the option to vote in person on election day or early voting period, mail-in ballots, or using new digital voting machines

Make sure to follow the instructions carefully for the method you choose. NC also requires voter ID's. If you need a voter ID, you can receive one for free. Visit <https://www.ncsbe.gov/voting/voter-id/get-free-voter-photo-id> to learn more about those requirements. Note: All voters will be allowed to vote even without an ID. However, they will have to fill out an ID exception form.



CANDIDATE INFORMATION

Learn more about the candidates running for office by visiting their campaign websites or watching candidate debates.

Don't forget to fact-check information before making your decision. Stay informed about local and national issues that may affect your community and consider how each candidate's platform addresses those issues.

As a voter, you have the right to cast your ballot without intimidation or harassment.

If you encounter any issues at the polls, you can report them to the election officials or call the voter protection hotline at 888-687-8683.

If you have a disability or need language assistance, you have the right to request accommodations at the polling location.

IMPORTANT VOTING DATES

October 11	Voter registration deadline. Deadline to register by mail, online and in-person
October 29	Absentee ballots. Deadline to apply for absentee ballots
October 17-November 2	Early Voting
November 5	Deadline to return absentee ballots; in-person voting opens 6:30am-7:30pm
